Corrections of Seal Beach Mutual 8's address as described in the Contract may be amended so as to correspond to its actual, legal address.

Mutual 8 CFO Report – December 2017

Welcome. Thank you for attending the December meeting of Mutual 8. Again, it's nice to see you and hear your input. I trust you are ready for Christmas – I wish I was.

The total Assets of Mutual 8 is \$4,753,039 with \$2,144,274 in Restricted Deposits and Investments. We have \$66,784 in cash and unrestricted Deposits. There is \$397,850 in excess income and we should perhaps consider using part of this as an investment, a Bond or a CD.

Significant Expenses over budget for November include the landscape fee (973), and maintenance replacement (3,823). Although electricity for October was within budget, unless our solar system is fixed, this will no longer be true. Out Total SCE energy charges for October was \$229.65 and the bill I signed this week for the latest SCE energy charges was \$942.72. These were just energy charges and didn't include distribution charges. Given the rates for buying electricity from SCE, the recommendation from the CFO is to bring out solar system into operational utilization.

Total operating expenses for the month of November was \$25,930 of a budgeted \$36,475 budgeted. Year-to-date, the Mutual has spent \$392,231 of a budgeted \$401,225. There is \$122,505 unused in the 2017 annual budget.

Income and contributions to capital, year-to-date is \$1,253,023 of a budgeted \$1,248,764. This puts us in reasonable fiscal State. We have, however, spent \$19,204 for off budget items.

Total market value plus accrued income from our investment Bank, BNYMellon equals \$1,252,070. The estimated yearly income is scheduled to be in the vicinity of \$54,181. Two bonds for \$91,087 were sold and two were purchased for \$112,431. I have discussed our investment strategy with our legal counsel to insure we were proceeding with due diligence.

PET REGISTRATION AND RENEWAL IN THE NEW YEAR

Pet Registration in Stock Transfer

Per Pet Policy 7501, Article II, your pet must be registered with the Stock Transfer Office before it is brought onto the Mutual premises. Further, the pet registration and licensing must be updated on or before December 31 of each year. The Mutual Pet Registration Form can be picked up at the Stock Transfer Office. To complete the registration, you will need to include the following:

Requirements for Dogs: City of Seal Beach Pet License, proof of spay or neuter, proof of dog's inoculations, proof of liability insurance, and proof of dog's weight.

Requirements for Cats: Proof of spay or neuter, and proof of liability insurance.

If you are <u>renewing</u> a currently-registered pet in the Stock Transfer Office, you do not need to complete a new form, but you do need to provide current liability insurance documents and, for dogs only, a current City of Seal Beach Pet License.

Pet Registration with City of Seal Beach

Note: The City of Seal Beach contracts with the City of Long Beach Animal Care Services for animal control and licensing purposes.

To purchase a City of Seal Beach Pet License, you will need to provide the following:

- History of prior licenses; a permanent license tag is issued when a license is first purchased.
- · Your name, address, and phone number.
- A current rabies inoculation certificate, good for the entire licensing period.
- A Certificate of Sterility if your pet has been spayed or neutered (altered). This will reduce your dog license fee. The certificate must be shown at time of purchase to receive the reduced rate.
- Microchip information (if applicable).
- Pet license fee.

There are several ways to purchase your City of Seal Beach pet license:

- In person at the Long Beach Bureau of Animal Care Services located at 7700 E. Spring Street.
- Online at: http://www.longbeach.gov/acs/pet-laws-and-licensing/licensing/
- By mail: send copies (this paperwork will not be returned so do not send originals) of the above information along with the pet license application to the Animal Care Services Bureau at 7700 E. Spring Street, Long Beach, CA 90815, along with a check or money order for the proper amount. The license will be processed and a license tag will be mailed to you.

- Replacement Tag: \$10;
- Cat Altered Senior Resident: N/A.






